Brighton Council has announced a broad range of measures in response to the COVID-19 emergency.

ORDINARY COUNCIL MEETINGS AND COUNCIL COMMITTEE MEETINGS

Ordinary Council Meetings are currently on hold due to the latest restrictions limiting gatherings to two people as of midnight tonight (30 March 2020).

State Government is currently looking at the legislation to allow Council meetings to be conducted remotely. The Premier should be providing notice shortly that allows Ordinary Council Meetings to legally be conducted remotely. We will keep the community informed on this.

All Council committee meetings have been put on hold until further notice. Any matters that would have normally been dealt with in committee, will be taken to Ordinary Council Meetings.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT MEASURES

Council has commenced implementing financial support measures for residents and ratepayers.

To date these immediate measures have included the following:

- Debt collection suspended until June 30, 2020.
- More flexible arrangements can be requested for payment of rates until June 30, 2020
- More flexible arrangements can be requested by debtors until June 30, 2020
- Council will implement a system of immediate payment of all invoices received from small or local businesses.
- Accumulation of interest on outstanding debts will be ceased until June 30, 2020.

An economic support package will be formally considered at the next Ordinary Council Meeting. The package will take into consideration what support is currently available from the State and Federal Governments.

As part of this economic support package, Council will **consider** the following measures:

- 1. Principle of no penalties, charges, interest or debt collection for late rate payments and extended payment periods until June 30, 2020.
- 2. Rent relief on council owned buildings where tenants are experiencing financial hardship until 30 June 2020.
- 3. A common approach to hardship/assistance policies to be developed by the Local Government Association of Tasmania (LGAT) in consultation with councils.
- 4. Community grants to be refocused as appropriate to support local businesses and not-for-profit recovery or conversion to digital environment or circular economy until June 30, 2021. And council to settle accounts within 14 days or shorter regardless of trade terms.
- 5. A 0% rate increase for 20/21 but fees and charges may be increased up to CPI.
