Community Action Plan Update – Damian Williams- Damian not present – Sonja advised that she has continued to monitor actions undertaken to support suicide prevention in this community. Pathways to care information session being presented on 9/3/21 between 9am-3.30pm. Free Training is also available online. ACTION: Sonja to send out a monthly update.</p> <p>c. e. Guest speaker/Focus Spots	a. HIPPY referral process Kellyanne gave an update on the HIPPY program, including program eligibility criteria, the referral process and how to become a HIPPY tutor. To be eligible for the program, Children need to be enrolled in Kindergarten and Participant families need to be from the Brighton Local Area and be eligible for a Health Care Card.

To be eligible for the program participants need to live in the Brighton municipality, be in receipt of a health care card, can be any age and must have completed 2 professional driving lessons. The program assists learner drivers to get their learning hours up. The program is currently looking for new mentors to conduct driving lessons. Mentors are required to undertake a police check and have a working with vulnerable person card.</p> <p>c. 26TEN – Simon asked the group for feedback regarding the possible uptake of the 26TEN grants. It was identified that there needs to further promotion of the grants to raise awareness. Simon agreed to provide more information regarding programs and grants.</p> <p>ACTION: Cathy to arrange a working group to consider a 26TEN grant application.</p>
