Brighton Alive minutes, 21st of March 2023

Welcome and acknowledgement

Moria shared an acknowledgement of Country. The group did an around the table, with names and services.

Brighton Alive Survey Response

The group looked over the survey results. It was discussed that there may need to be another survey, to look into the results. For example, it was found that not everyone finds it a welcoming environment, and the need to look further into that and what makes people feel this way to be able to fix it. It was also found that subgroups were something the network wants to have again, and that the discussion and organising for this would need a meeting of its own. The group has had subgroups in the past when something comes up, e.g. Covid, mental health & events.

Brighton Council Update

Britt shared, with sadness that she is leaving her role to move to the mainland. Her last day will be the 27th of April, but she will be flying back for youth week.

Terms of Reference

The group discussed the terms of reference for Brighton Alive, and historically how this has worked. Originally, the network was for service providers and it was debated whether services feel comfortable to chat about their programs, issues etc with community in the room. It was noted that over half of the service providers are also community members, and that there was a positive shift when more community joined. It was then discussed on whether community know if they can join and whether an open invite needs to be shared.

Tanya noted that we don't want to double up on meetings and tables etc and a workshop might benefit, to see who sits on Kutalayna Collective tables, and how the purposes for each group may align. Britt will pull a few dates together and see what times work for people, noting it would be a great opportunity for the new Community Development Officer to be apart of.

Other business

- Sonya shared the dates for the Drag Quiz night. The quiz night is a fundraiser for local student Kyeisha, who is hoping to travel to LA to attend a music academy. <u>Link for more</u> information.
- Christina from Centacare Evolve Housing shared the issues they are having with vandalism at
 their properties, specifically the one they are selling to help fund Build Up Tassie. Christina
 wants to know how this can be addressed as a community, not focusing on punishment but
 a solution. The group discussed having a safety and respect forum. Liana shared that a 4
 Corners video from Bourke, called <u>'Backing Bourke'</u> is worth a watch when brainstorming
 what can be done.

The group will think about what they can do and come back to the next meeting with ideas.

- It was shared that the Community Shed is looking for a shed supervisor. The supervisor is a volunteer position and would suit anyone with skills and the knowledge of tools, to engage with community.
- Louise shared the start of the <u>Brighton and Surrounds Gardening Club</u>, which occurs on the fourth Monday of each month at the Pontville Community Hall
- Britt shared that the <u>Community Grants</u> are open and close on the 4th of April at 5pm
